About Palmerston North

Palmerston North has been often called the 'Rose city' because of its rose gardens. True enough, it has numerous reasons to bloom as it moves forward with charming sophistication and interesting diversity. This city, fondly called 'Palmy' by many, was named in honour of the former British Prime Minister Viscount Palmerston.

Located 140km northeast or just about a two-hour drive from the capital, Wellington, Palmy is also close to the picturesque Tararua ranges with the stunning Manawatū Gorge.

It is said to be an outdoor enthusiast's dream with scenic walks and bike trails. So, it is not surprising that this natural side of Palmy came from its origins, for it was once a forest until sold to the Crown in 1864. An aerial view of Palmerston North will still show remnants of its forestry heritage. It still is surrounded by green paddocks and beautiful rugged mountains.

In its history, Palmerston North's rise began when immigration and public works were revived in 1871. Scandinavians were its first settlers who, together with others, began building the roads of Palmy. For many years, Palmerston North relied on public works and sawmilling. It was in 1886 when its future was assured. It was during this time that the West Coast railway from Wellington was built and pastoral farming was underway. Today, Palmerston North is a leading light in agriculture research, home to many important research institutions such as the Massey AgResearch and Food HQ.

Diversity in Palmy

Palmerston North is located in the Manawatū region, which was the first refugee settlement for the country with Pahiatua welcoming refugees in the 1940s. Since then, the region has opened its doors to thousands of refugees who have created a rich culture of colour and community.

Many ethnic communities call Palmy home – 76 percent of its population identify as European, 19 percent as Māori, 12 percent as Asian, 5 percent as Pacific peoples, and 3 percent as other ethnicities.

There are about 810 Filipinos living in Palmerston North and about 1,740 in the Manawatū-Whanganui region working in various fields and industries.

Economy

Palmerston North's central business district is located on The Square, around which still stand buildings from the 1920s and 1930s, having been restored and converted to charming boutiques, cafes, and restaurants. A rich mix of dining can be found in The Square with ethnic eateries that reflect the blend of communities in the city: Cambodian, Vietnamese, South and North Indian, and Italian restaurants.

For the year ended December 2021, the city's <u>provisional estimate of GDP grew 7.8 percent</u>, outpacing the national growth of 5.5 percent. Consumer spending was up 9.3 percent compared with 5.0 percent across the country as a whole. There was also a 16 percent rise in tourist spending compared to the 3.9 percent growth across New Zealand. Employment in Palmerston North rose 1.8 percent compared with a 1.7 percent rise nationwide.





Governance

Palmerston North city is governed by a council currently headed by Mayor Smith Grant and 15 councillors. The council's functions are divided into six units: strategy and planning, customer, finance, community, infrastructure, and marketing & communications.

Get to know Palmy



ANZAC Park

This clifftop park, also known as Te Motu-o-Poutoa, is a memorial to fallen soldiers from the area and was once the site of a Rangitāne pa. The park has great views across the city as well as a walking track. On a clear day, it's

possible to see both Mount Ruapehu and Mount Taranaki. Many locals know this park by its colloquial name, Pork Chop Hill.

To reach the park, travel over the Fitzherbert Bridge towards the Summerhill Drive off-ramp taking the first left turn into Cliff Road. A narrow road leads to the clifftop, which is shared by traffic going in both directions, so take care. A wide grassy area for the kids to play waits to greet you, and a loop track through the remnant bush. The road barrier opens at 7 am and closes at 6 pm every day. Note that the trail to the top of the park remains accessible if you want to go on foot.

Manawatū River Pathway

If you're after some fresh air and sunshine, walk along this flat path which follows the Manawatū River from the end of Maxwells Line through to Riverside Drive. It links up with <u>He Ara Kotahi</u>, a riverside pathway perfect for walks or drives where you can see stunning views of the Manawatū River. Several bridges connect the

route, including the star attraction, the He Ara Kotahi Bridge, which is lit up at night creating the illusion that it's floating on the water.

Alongside the river is <u>Victoria Esplanade</u>, a diverse inner-city park with bush walks, bird aviaries, picture-perfect rose gardens, several playgrounds and adventure forts, miniature train rides, and a state-of-the-art Junior Road Safety Park.

At the centre of Victoria Esplanade is New Zealand's only native wildlife recovery centre, Wildbase Recovery. Take a tour and learn about our native wildlife and meet the resident animals and patients rehabilitating after treatment at Wildbase Hospital. The interactive educational area is perfect for kids of all ages, and you'll get up close to some of the country's favourite birdlife.

Take a ride on New Zealand's premier miniature railway, which travels along a 2.2km track through Victoria Esplanade's beautiful park, playground, and native bush. Fun for all ages, the railway operates on weekends, and on school and public holidays.

Junior Road Safety Park

Victoria Esplanade

Inside Victoria Esplanade is the Junior Road Safety Park, which was designed for children to practise riding bikes in an environment that has all the features of an actual roadway minus cars.



It has roundabout, give-way and stop

signs, traffic lights at a four-way intersection, and traffic islands. The park has plenty of shade, shelter, seating, and even a cycle station where you can pump up tyres and carry out adjustments to your bikes.



Dugald Mackenzie Rose Garden Victoria Esplanade

Dugald MacKenzie Rose Garden is the pride of Palmerston North. Opened in 1968 and located inside Victoria Esplanade, the garden has three sections: formal rose beds, trial grounds, and plant variety rights collection. The garden contains over 5,000 roses in named beds. It is

much admired by many local, national, and international visitors. The garden was named after Dugald MacKenzie, Superintendent of Parks and Reserves from 1946 to 1966, who contributed significantly to the garden's development.

The garden is also home to the New Zealand Rose Society International Rose Trial Grounds. These trials, which have been held for 33 years, are to test roses that have not been commercially sold before. A panel of judges assess the roses over a two-year period, evaluating plant health, freedom of flowering, appearance, fragrance, and novelty.



Caccia Birch House

Caccia Birch House is a historic wedding and conference venue, set among landscaped grounds with sweeping views over Hokowhitu Lagoon. Built-in 1895, the house is located on three acres just 2km from the city.





Hokowhitu Lagoon

Hokowhitu Lagoon, also sometimes called Centennial Lagoon, is a natural oxbow lake created from a meander of the Manawatū River. Many features surround the lagoon including a walkway, Caccia Birch House, and a former campus of Massey University, facilities of which are now used by the New Zealand Defence Force, Te Wānanga o Aotearoa, and the Abbey Theatre Company.



This conservation waterway and surrounding park is a great place to feed the ducks, kayak on the water, or enjoy a weekend picnic with the whole family.

Travel by bus

All buses arrive and depart from <u>i-SITE</u> during the day, and opposite the Courthouse on Main Street at night.

The nationwide bus service provider is Intercity.

Travel by train

Capital Connection

Capital Connection is a return service between Palmerston North and Wellington, running Monday to Friday. This train does not operate on weekends, public holidays, or over the Christmas and New Year holidays. It provides a convenient commuter service to the capital or a stress-free travel experience for visitors to either city.

The Capital Connection leaves Palmerston North Railway Station at 6.15 am and arrives in Wellington at 8.20 am. It departs Wellington at 5.15 pm and arrives back in Palmerston North at 7.20 pm.

Northern Explorer

The Northern Explorer train service operates between Auckland and Wellington, stopping at Palmerston North along the way.

The train runs southbound (to Wellington) on Monday, Thursday, and Saturday, leaving Palmerston North at 4.20 pm. It returns north (to Auckland) on Tuesday, Friday, and Sunday, leaving Palmerston North at 10 am.

Sports Tournaments

General rules

- 1. All participants must represent (that is, be a current member of) a club, society, or sporting group recognised by the Federation and MUST either be any of the following:
 - Filipino (natural or naturalised)
 - married to or a partner of a Filipino
 - of Filipino descent.

A player who is a partner of or is married to a Filipino must provide proof that they are currently living with their spouse or partner by way of any document which shows their names as residents of the same address. Failure to provide eligibility may mean disqualification of the player for the rest of the tournament, forfeiture of the team's won points if the event had been completed, and a \$500 fine paid to the PCA. Further, the club, society, or sporting group must indicate the New Zealand city to which they belong and must be a current financial member of the Federation.

- 2. Practise fair play at all times. Remember, we are here to have fun, so let us ensure it's all about fun and camaraderie.
- 3. Show respect for your teammates and opponents. Represent your teams with honour and pride through good sportsmanship.
- 4. Wear the necessary sports-specific gear at all times (proper footwear, knee cap, etc). PCA endeavours to provide a safe environment. However, we are not liable for injuries caused by neglecting to wear the proper sports gear.
- 5. All participants in any of the events are expected and are personally responsible for ensuring they are in good health and are fit to play before participating in any of the sports competitions this year.
- 6. PCA reserves the right to intervene in any game and apply specific (House) rules to a team or individual to ensure a safe environment exists for all participants.
- 7. Spectators must not be in the playing area, especially children, during the games. If you have children, please ensure they are positioned safely. Games will not proceed until safety has been achieved.
- 8. Entry by any person, club, society, or group in this competition means acceptance of the rules and any decision made by the PCA and the Federation Sports Committee.
- 9. All participants are REQUIRED to attach with their team's registration of players, a photo ID with a date of birth (e.g., NZ driver's license or passport) prior to the game as proof. If a player cannot show proof on the day, he will be automatically disqualified from the game. This rule applies to basketball in the Age group category where the player should present a photocopy of their school ID with their date of birth prior to the games.

Creative folk-dance competition 2022

Rules and regulations

- 1. All entries must either be an associate or a full financial and current member of the Federation of Filipino Associations, Societies and clubs in New Zealand Incorporated (FFASCNZI).
- 2. The competition is open to all Filipinos and Filipino-Kiwi living in New Zealand who wish to represent their region's Filipino Community. Each Region is open to having one or more competing group entries.

Requirements

- 1. Fully completed entry form.
- 2. Endorsement form by the sponsoring organisation.
- 3. Proof of residency of participating members NZ citizenship certificate or passport.
- 4. The participant or group of participants is required to present a creative Philippine folk dance performance and must submit a Creative Philippine Folkdance Description Form.
- 5. An Acknowledgement of Sponsor Exclusivity Form must be submitted. The form will be completed by the full financial member club/society/organisation that endorsed/sponsored the candidate.

General rules and regulations

- 1. The dance is open with a Fiesta type of Philippine Folk dance and the participating group is free to use any Philippine folk dance music.
- 2. The team is allowed to combine a number of Philippine folk dances creatively.
- 3. Staging must be implemented and the team will be allowed to modify the dance steps, costumes and music.
- 4. A minimum of 8 members and a maximum of 12 members per competing group is needed. Male/female or a combination of both is allowed.

- 5. Hand-carried props are allowed except sharp/breakable/flammable objects and other kinds of liquids.
- 6. The performance of each group should not exceed 5 minutes and not less than 3 minutes including the set-up, performance and breakdown.
- 7. Timer starts when the signal flag will be raised by the committee as soon as the participating group enters the stage.
- 8. Materials/Props that will cause the stage to become slippery or dangerous are strictly prohibited. The committee has the right to refuse materials/props that may be deemed hazardous.
- 9. Materials/ Props must not bear the name/ logo of the club's sponsor who is a business competitor of the premier/exclusive sponsor of Pistang Pilipino.
- 10. Exceeding the time of every (10) ten seconds will be automatically deducted from the total score of (1) one point by the committee.
- 11. Competing teams will have a drawing of lots one week before the competition.
- 12. Only official entry music must be saved in the flash drive/CD and labelled with the team's number. This must be submitted to the technical committee a week before the competition.
- 13. Submission of the entry form will start on 01 June 2022 and confirmation of entry must be made to the Dance Committee.
- 14. The deadline for registration is 31 July 2022. The registration Fee is TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS only (\$200) per entry and must be done online through the Pistang Pilipino 2022 sa Palmerston North website.
- 15. A properly filled-up registration form with the list of names of the dancers and one group picture must be submitted to the Dance Committee at least three weeks before the competition.
- 16. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.
- 17. Any inquiries should be addressed to the chairman of the Dance Committee.





18. Any complaints or recommendations for disqualifications due to violations of the aforementioned guidelines should be expressed in written form and addressed to the committee. Attach pertinent documents as proof.

Judging and scoring

- 1. There will be up to seven (7) judges appointed by the Organising Committee.
- 2. The judge position may be offered to a sponsor or donor of Pistang Pilipino as part of the sponsorship agreement. However, the judge MUST NOT be a member of a club/group/organization who is affiliated with or member of the Federation.
- 3. The judges' decision is final and irrevocable. No appeals will be considered. Any protest regarding the result of the competition will not be accepted.
- 4. Each individual/group participant will be awarded a score or points for each criterion ranging from 1.0 to 20.0, with 1.0 being the lowest score/point.
- 5. Each of the judge's scores for a participant will be added and will be the Total Score
- 6. Candidates who garner the 3 highest Total Scores will be declared as First, Second and Third Prize winners.
- 7. Should there be a tie in the total score of the Top 3 winners, the head of the panel of judges shall agree on the manner on how to break it.
- 8. Special Awards may be awarded amongst all the participants based from the criteria or as determined by the Organising Committee.

Meet the candidates

The candidates are officially presented to the public at the 'Meet and greet" event on Friday, 21 October.

Talent presentation

Each candidate performs on stage to express their extraordinary skills and to demonstrate how well they connect with others through entertainment.

Pageant rules

Eligibility

Previous winners of the Miss Philippines–New Zealand pageant are not eligible. Candidates must be:

- 16–24 years of age as at Pistang Pilipino sa Palmerston North 2022
- at least 5 feet tall in bare feet (1.52cm)
- single (never been married) or have never had a child as a single parent
- of Filipino descent
- a New Zealand permanent resident or citizen
- endorsed/sponsored by a club, society, or organisation that is a full financial member of the Federation.

Entries

Fully completed forms must be submitted by Sunday, **31 July 2022**. Entries must include:

- official entry form and declaration forms
- endorsement form
- copy of birth certificate
- proof of residency in New Zealand or citizenship (photocopy acceptable)
- photograph of candidate 10 x 15cm full head and shoulder
- entry fee of TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS only (\$200).

Other requirements

Each candidate will be required to present herself during the pageant in the following categories:

- **Philippine costume** wear her own interpretation of our national costume called 'Baro't saya', sometimes called 'Balintawak' or 'Maria Clara'
- **swimsuit** one-piece swimwear will be supplied by the host city but candidate must prepare her own as back-up.
- evening wear.

Judging and scoring

- There will be up to seven judges appointed by the organising committee.
- The judges' decision will be final and no appeals will be considered.
- Each candidate will be awarded a score ranging from 1.0 to 9.9, with 1.0 being the lowest.
- The candidate's score in each category in the first round given by a judge will be averaged and will count as the candidate's score from a particular judge.
- Each of the judge's scores for a candidate in the first round will be added and will be the candidate's total score in the first round.
- Candidates in the top 5 of total scores in the first round qualify for the semi-final round.
- When the semi-final round begins, all scores will be reset to zero and judging/scoring will then be based on the criteria or category for the semi-final round.
- The three candidates who scored highest in the Q&A portion of the semi-final round will be declared finalists.
- When the final round begins, all scores of the three finalists will be reset to zero and judging will be based on one question.
- The Special Awards or the Non-Bearing Awards are decided by the judges among all the candidates based on the criteria in the first round.

First-round

The outcome of this round will determine who will go into the semi-finals. The candidates will be judged on the following five criteria.

Talent presentation (20%)

- Each candidate will perform a three-minute performing arts talent presentation.
- Talent presentation will constitute a Filipino cultural aspect.
- Talents may include but are not limited to, vocals in every medium, dance in all forms, gymnastics, and use of musical instruments.
- The candidate must perform on stage alone and without any back-ups or assistance.





National costume (20%)

Each candidate's costume will be judged on their personal interpretation of a Filipino costume that demonstrates a combination of Filipino tradition and contemporary haute couture based on fabric, colour, creativity, and design.

Swimsuit (20%)

- Candidates will be judged based on stage presence, poise, and appearance.
- They can use a sarong or sombrero, but the sarong must be removed when approaching the front of the stage.

Evening wear (20%)

Criteria for judging the evening wear competition includes overall appearance, poise, grace, stage presence, and appropriateness of the evening wear.

Personality (20%)

- Judged on how the candidate presents herself and interacts with others.
- This will be assessed by the judges over the period of the pageant, including during the Friday evening 'Meet the candidates' function.

Semi-final round (Q&A portion – five finalists)

- The candidate will randomly pick the judge who will ask her the question and each question will be read twice.
- Judges will ask the candidates questions on stage. Each candidate will have 30 seconds to answer the question.
- All questions will be in English and no interpreters are allowed.
- Points will be awarded on the basis of the candidates' response in context, poise, personality, wittiness, and intelligence.
- Questions may come from the candidates' fact sheet, and may include cultural, heritage, current, and general events.

Final round (three finalists)

- In the final round, each of the three finalists will be asked the same question as determined by the judges. While one finalist is answering the question, the other two will be asked to leave the stage so that they will not hear the question being asked.
- After the scores have been answered and totalled as before, winners will be declared in accordance with the scores they obtained. The highest score among the finalists will be crowned Miss Philippines–New Zealand 2022, second-highest will be 1st runner-up, and third will be 2nd runner-up.

- Miss Talent
- Miss Photogenic
- Miss Friendship

- Best in National Costume
- Best in Swim Wear
- Best in Evening Wear

- Miss Popularity
 - Audience participation
 - Vote via Facebook
 - Candidate with the highest vote is the winner.

About the Miss Philippines–New Zealand Crown

The Crown remains the property of the Federation. Hence, each year the winner gets to wear the Crown for one year, which will then be passed on to the next year's winner. It is the responsibility of the previous year's host club/city to ensure that Crown is passed on to the next year's pageant hosts.

Important note

In the event that there are only five pageant candidates and the host organising committee of *Pistang Pilipino* decides to proceed with the beauty pageant, judging criteria for First Round and Semi-Final Round will still be done or combined and the top three highest scoring candidates will qualify for the Final Round of the competition.
